Morality and Rational Choice Aug 20 2022 This book develops and defends a version of utilitarianism, including expected-utility theory, as a normative model of decision making. The defense, based on the idea of utility as achievement of goals, considers the endorsement of a norm as a decision and asks what reasons we have to endorse norms for decision making. The reasons derive from our pre-existing goals, so any norm we endorse must not fly in the face of these goals, although it must not be selfishly biased, either. This approach is further clarified by drawing distinctions between decisions for the self, for a single other person, for several others, and for the self and others. Right Actions and Good Persons Mar 23 2020 Deals with the contemporary ethical controversy between the agent-centred and act-centred approaches to moral theory. It discusses whether moral theory should focus on the good life of the agent or whether it should provide the criterion for right actions. The aim of the book is to examine whether an agent-centred approach of some kind can provide an acceptable alternative to the act-centred ones that have long dominated the discussion. To do this, it analyzes the argumentation of influential advocates of this view such as Martha Nussbaum and Charles Taylor. On the basis of this analysis, it is concluded that the promoters of the agent-centred view fail to provide such an alternative. The book also defends the act-centred approach by showing that when properly understood and clearly defined, it can still offer a justifiable account of morality.

Essays on Ethics, Social Behaviour, and Scientific Explanation Aug 28 2020 When John Harsanyi came to Stanford University as a candidate for the Ph.D., I asked him why he was bothering, since it was most unlikely that he had anything to learn from us. He was already a known scholar; in addition to some papers in economics, the first two papers in this volume had already been published and had dazzled me by their originality and their combination of philosophical insight and technical competence. However, I am very glad I did not discourage him; whether he learned anything worthwhile I don't know, but we all learned much from him on the foundations of the theory of games and specifically on the outcome of bargaining. The central focus of Harsanyi's work has continued to be in the theory of games, but especially on the foundations and conceptual problems. The theory of games, properly understood, is a very broad approach to social interaction based on individually rational behavior, and it connects closely with fundamental methodological and substantive issues in social science and in ethics. An indication of the range of Harsanyi's interest in game theory can be found in the first paper of Part B - though in fact his own contributions are much

broader-and in the second paper the applications to the methodology of social science. The remaining papers in that section show more specifically the richness of game theory in specific applications.

Basic Writings Apr 04 2021 This book contains the first English translations of *The Origin of the Moral Sensations* and *Psychological Observations*, the two most important works by the German philosopher Paul Rée. These essays present Rée's moral philosophy, which influenced the ideas of his close friend Friedrich Nietzsche considerably. In placing Nietzsche in his intellectual and social context, Small profoundly challenges the myth of Nietzsche as a solitary thinker.

Making Morality Work Feb 26 2023 Most of us hope to do what morality requires of us. But what if we can't figure out what it does require? To be sure, we are sometimes warned that the principles (which must exist?) may be too complex to be formulated. Also they may not exist prior to action - nonetheless, we are told, they serve as guides to conduct!
