**Do Interest Rate Controls Work? Evidence from Kenya** Sep 20 2022 This paper reviews the impact of interest rate controls in Kenya, introduced in September 2016. The intent of the controls was to reduce the cost of borrowing, expand access to credit, and increase the return on savings. However, we find that the law on interest rate controls has had the opposite effect of what was intended. Specifically, it has led to a collapse of credit to micro, small, and medium enterprises; shrinking of the loan book of the small banks; and reduced financial intermediation. We also show that interest rate caps reduced the signaling effects of monetary policy. These suggest that (i) the adverse effects could largely be avoided if the ceiling was high enough to facilitate lending to higher risk borrowers; and (ii) alternative policies could be preferable to address concerns about the high cost of credit.

**Quota Formula - Data Update** Dec 23 2022 The IMF staff has updated individual member country data for the variables used in the quota formula for the period 2001-13. The staff paper also presents updated calculated quota shares based on the current quota formula. The current quota formula includes a GDP variable, which is a blend of GDP at market rates and GDP at purchasing power parity (PPP), openness, variability, and international reserves. The International Monetary and Financial Committee has called for agreement on a new quota formula as part of the 15th General Review of Quotas. The paper presents a limited set of illustrative simulations of possible reforms of the quota formula using the updated quota data. These simulations are purely illustrative and do not represent proposals. The new data tables that can be downloaded via the below link include also the comparable value of each variable for the previous quota dataset, which was based on data covering the period 2000-2012. **Is Capping Executive Bonuses Useful?** Mar 22 2020 This paper develops a theoretical framework to study the impact of bonus caps on banks' risk taking. In the model, labor market price adjustments can offset the direct effects of bonus caps. The calibrated model suggests that bonus caps are only effective when bank executives' mobility is restricted. It also suggests, irrespective of the degree of labor market mobility, bonus caps simultaneously reduce risk shifting by bank executives (too much risk taking because of limited liability), but aggravate underinvestment (bank executives foregoing risky but productive projects). Hence, the welfare effects of bonus caps critically depend on initial conditions, including the relative importance of risk shifting versus underinvestment.

The use of disinfection caps removes the human factor and allows for no variation (DeVries and others, 2014). **Impacts of Interest Rate Cap on Financial Inclusion in Cambodia** Feb 25 2023 Interest rate caps, despite their intended objective of broadening financial inclusion, can have undesirable effects on financial inclusion under certain conditions. This paper examines the effect of microfinance-loan interest rate caps on financial inclusion in Cambodia. Based on a difference-in-difference analysis on bank and microfinance supervisory data, results show some unintended impact on financial inclusion. The cap led to a significant increase in non-interest fees charged on new loans following the introduction of an annual cap. Microfinance borrowers declined immediately, amid an increase in credit growth, as microfinance institutions targeted larger borrowers at the expense of smaller ones. Microfinance institutions, responded differently to the cap, considering their own operation and funding costs, and client base. Two years after the cap, institutions resumed lending to a wider group of borrowers with lower funding and operation costs brought by mobile payment development.

This work contributes to the scholarly and policy dialogue on financial inclusion, working-class poverty and the development and legitimacy of fringe lending. This book analyses the motivation, content and outcome of critical regulatory episodes that have shaped fringe banking. While historians have written volumes about consumer credit, few have analysed why elite policymakers have sought to protect the working poor from some credit markets. This work demonstrates that, across time, conflicting views on poverty and liberal economic theory have, to varying degrees, influenced how the government has protected the working poor, and will be of interest to financial and economic historians.

*The Use of Alcohol Impregnated Caps in Prevention of Central Line Bloodstream Infections* Jan 12 2022 The Affordable Care Act of 2010 has resulted in many changes in healthcare reimbursement resulting in hospitals and various institutions adopting evidence-based research into practice in order to maintain their financial health. One particular issue is the non-reimbursement for hospital acquired preventable infections (Peasah, 2013). One main illness of research is central line bloodstream infections or CLABSI which develop in the hospital setting. This preventable illness occurs primarily through the injection port of a central line where the nurse is administering medications. According to infection control guidelines regarding the administration of intravenous medications, a fifteen second alcohol scrub to the injection port must be performed before the infusion of medication (JCAH, 2013). Unfortunately, this is not occurring, and as a result, bacteria on the port is injected into the patient's bloodstream (DeVries, 2014). Along with the Affordable Care Act, reimbursement from Medicare and Medicaid will not be given to any hospital or facility involving the development of a CLABSI, thus adding a financial burden. A typical CLABSI costs between \$6,000-22,000 (VDH, 2014). Research has devoted much time and effort into the prevention of CLABSI resulting in the introduction of alcohol impregnated caps being applied to all central line injection ports in the aid in of providing continuous disinfection by preventing bacteria from harboring on the port and then being injected into the patient's bloodstream resulting in infection (Berenholtz, 2014). The following paper will present evidence-based research with a proposal of care plan involving the use of alcohol impregnated caps to a hospital's central line care plan, Glens Falls Hospital, New York, with the goal of decreasing CLABSI by discussing the important role in the use of alcohol impregnated caps to all central line injection ports as an added benefit to replace the typical fifteen second alcohol scrub for the prevention of blood stream infection and thus allow for financial benefit to the hospital or facility involved in caring for a patient with a central line.
