Different sound sources were considered in terms of their acoustic characteristics and appropriate metrics defined for measurement of the received levels. The resultant sound exposure guidelines are presented in a set of tables. In some cases numerical guidelines are provided, expressed in appropriate metrics. When there were insufficient data to support numerical values, the relative likelihood of effects occurring was evaluated, although the actual likelihood of effects depends on the received level. These sound exposure guidelines, which are based on the best scientific information at the time of writing, should be treated as interim. The expectation is that with more research the guidelines can be refined and more cells in the tables completed. Recommendations are put forward defining the research requirements of highest priority for extending these interim exposure guidelines.

**Theft Offences Guideline - Consultation** Sep 13 2021 The Sentencing Council periodically issues draft Sentencing

Guidelines for public consultation. Under s. 120(6)(c) of the Coroners and Justice Act 2009, the Council is required to consult the House of Commons Justice Committee on draft Guidelines. The proposed Theft Offences Guideline was issued by the Sentencing Council on 3 April 2014. The draft guideline is split into separate guidelines for (i) theft from a shop or stall (ii) general theft (iii) abstracting electricity (iv) making off without payment (v) handling stolen goods and (v) going equipped for theft or burglary. The Committee broadly supports the principles on which the Theft Offences Guideline is based, welcoming in particular the emphasis on placing the impact on victims of theft at the heart of the sentencing process. The Sentencing Council should encourage sentencers to consider the use of Restorative Justice in the sentencing process in areas where it is available, while emphasising that it must always be victim-led and intended to benefit those who have been the subject of crime rather than the offender.

**Chronic Aortic Regurgitation** Dec 05 2020 Sir Dominic Corrigan's classic monograph "On Permanent Patency of the Mouth of the Aorta, or Inadequacy of the Aortic Valves" was published in 1832. Descriptions of aortic regurgitation had previously been published by others, but Corrigan's contribution was so comprehensive that his name is still closely associated with this disorder. He described the physical findings and the underlying gross pathologic anatomy of aortic regurgitation. He recognized that sudden death was not characteristic of aortic regurgitation, as it was in aortic stenosis, and his therapeutic approach was based on firm physiologic principles. In the past 150 years we have expanded Corrigan's work, and we have developed a detailed appreciation of the natural history, pathophysiology, diagnostic methods, and treatment of chronic aortic regurgitation. Fifteen years ago, cardiac catheterization and angiography had already achieved widespread application in the evaluation of aortic regurgitation, but cardiac ultrasound,

especially Doppler echocardiography, was in its infancy, and the utility of radionuclide ventriculography was not widely appreciated.

### **Compliance With The 2014 ESC/ESA Guidelines On Non-Cardiac Surgery Preoperative Cardiovascular Assessment By 5 Tertiary Greek Hospitals**

Nov 03 2020 Background and goal of the study: In 2014 the European Society of Cardiology and the European Society of Anaesthesiology published guidelines on preoperative assessment and management of non-cardiac surgery patients<sup>1</sup>. The objective of the study was to evaluate the rate of compliance with the task force recommendations by 5 major tertiary Greek hospitals. Materials and methods: A retrospective observational cohort study was designed. 5 tertiary Greek hospitals participated in the study between February 2016 and April 2016. The adult ASA 1-4 patients who underwent non-cardiac surgery were included. Patients treated in Intensive Care Unit were excluded. The preanesthetic charts were reviewed and the information about the age, surgical risk, ASA classification, the cardiological history and medication, the physical examination findings, and the tests ordered was recorded. A total of 5009 records were reviewed. The main outcomes were the rates of compliance with the published recommendations of the following parameters: preoperative testing (electrocardiogram [ECG], heart ultrasound, heart imaging stress testing, invasive coronary angiography), continuation or not of medication (b-blockers, statins, angiotensin-converting enzyme inhibitors [ACEIs] and angiotensin-receptor blockers [ARBs]) and overall compliance with the recommendations. Results and discussion: 63,8% (3197) of the preoperative ECGs, 83,8% (522) of the heart ultrasonographies and 93,2% (55) of the non-invasive stress tests should have been performed. On the other hand, only

30,3% (101) and 6% (4) of the patients that should or could have been evaluated with a heart ultrasound and a non-invasive stress test respectively, did the recommended tests. B-blockers and statins were correctly continued to all the patients who were taking them. 1055 patients were receiving ACEIs or ARBs for hypertension and should have discontinued their medication, but none did. 53,4% (31) of the patients with known systolic heart failure were not being treated with ACEIs or ARBs as they should and were operated despite the recommendation to begin treatment for at least 1 week before surgery. The overall percentage of the patients managed exactly as recommended was only 27,3%. Conclusion: The 2014 guidelines for preoperative management of the non-cardiac surgery patients are not sufficiently being followed by the Greek hospitals.
